The Body of Christ Building the Body of Christ

The Tidewater Emmaus Board announced a new initiative for the Community at the November 20 Gathering. If you were not able to attend please review the following:

What if we were able to take the cost of sustaining a year of Tidewater Emmaus and Chrysalis and spread it across the entire Community? This would mean instead of relying on love offerings collected at Gatherings, and teaming and sponsorship fees paid by teamers and sponsors, we would leverage the support of the entire Community to strengthen the Kingdom of Christ.

Fourth Day Operating Expenses

Fourth Day operating expenses are covered through love offerings collected at Gatherings and through special donations made by Community members. These expenses, that support both Emmaus and Chrysalis, include:

Music dues, insurance, legal services (on retainer), post office box, childcare at Gatherings and DODU, music equipment and projector maintenance, weekend supplies (folders, flash paper, play dough, etc.), and weekend manuals for the leadership teams.

Each year these expenses come to \$5,331

Walks and Flights

The cost of a Chrysalis season: two full Chrysalis flights (boys and girls), including teaming fees and sponsorship fees = \$11,852

The cost of an Emmaus season: two full walks, full teams, sponsorship fees, CST fees, and teaming fees: \$25,020. Two Emmaus seasons each year = \$50,040

How it Breaks Down

Currently Tidewater Emmaus has 880 members who receive our emails and Newsletters. What if every member were able to give just a little agape donation to support the Community. What would it take to fund an entire year of Tidewater Emmaus and Chrysalis?

If all 880 members of the Community were able to donate \$16 each, by the December gathering, we would collect enough agape funds to support the entire Chrysalis season.

If all 880 members of the Community were able to donate \$32 each by the March gathering we would collect enough funds to support the men's and women's walks in the spring.

If all 880 members of the Community were able to donate \$32 each by the September gathering we would collect enough funds to support the men's and women's walks in the fall.

These figures include the Fourth Day operating expenses. So there would be no need to collect offerings at Gatherings.

How is this done?

So how could we do this? Surely we don't have 880 members coming to Gatherings or available to team or sponsor. Most of our members are committed to ministries at their churches. This is exactly what we are called to do as Christian leaders who have attended an Emmaus weekend. We are supposed to put our church first in service and in financial support.

After tithing to our church, what if there were an easy, convenient way for any and all Community members to support Tidewater Emmaus and Chrysalis?

We are setting up a feature that facilitates online donations on behalf of Tidewater Emmaus and Chrysalis. This utility allows Community members near and far, from recent walks, and the very first to support the Emmaus community that they love.

There are several benefits to this program:

1. If enough donations are received we can fund an entire year of Tidewater Emmaus and Chrysalis and have no need for teaming fees, sponsorship fees, CST fees, or offering buckets
2. If partial funding is received to support the Community that funding will still have an impact on our ability to reduce our fees ... and this is a good thing!
3. Donations made to the Agape Donation Fund are tax deductible!
4. It provides a way for Community members to give back, even if they cannot make a commitment of their time.

With no fees to worry about, consider the reach we could have to everyone in the Tidewater area. How many Christian leaders could we build up and send out glowing with the love of Christ?

**Pilgrims and caterpillars would still be responsible for their weekend deposit. This is an essential component to confirming their commitment to the weekend.

On the Horizon

Shortly the Tidewater Emmaus web site will be updated to include a “donate now” button. Community members can use this button to give once, give throughout the year, or donate on a monthly basis. You can set up monthly donations too. A minimum donation of \$10 each month (a requirement of our online donation service, JustGive.org) is required if you choose this option. Each time you donate you will receive an email receipt that can be used for your tax deduction filing.

Donations to the Agape fund via check or cash could still be made directly to Tidewater Emmaus/Chrysalis without using the “Donate Now” button.

These are NOT dues. Donating is NOT required. We simply wanted to give you an idea of what it would take for the Body of Christ to build the Body of Christ.

It comes down to \$80/year for each of our 880 members ... it averages out to \$6.67/month per community member. Pretty amazing when you break it down isn't it?

The Board will communicate the status of the Agape donation fund each month. One month prior to a flight or walk season, the Board will review the available funds and inform Community members of the balance due that is required to sponsor, team, or work CST for that walk or flight season.

We cannot predict the status of the funds for any weekend season at this time. For now, plan on the current fees and be pleasantly surprised to learn what the actual fees will be ... perhaps \$0!
